Madam President,

I am Tom Levy and I am one of Israel's youth delegates to the UN. The Olympic message of fellowship, unity, culture, victory and equality is as important today as it ever has been. In a world beginning to recover from the COVID-19 Pandemic, and intent on building back better, sport and the Olympic ideal can be an important tool for the promotion of human rights, development, conciliation and dialogue.
