In this new Covid-19 reality, women face a heavier burden of care for children and other beneficiaries and have lost their jobs in a higher percentage than men. While there is pressure to act quickly, all efforts for recovery should be gender-responsive.

The achievements already made in promoting gender equality are at risk. Every country, in order to build back better, needs to continue to work towards achieving it in all fields. The decisions made now will have long-term effects on the stabilization and resilience of communities, especially of women and girls.
