

## UN Human Rights Council UPR Working Group 28<sup>th</sup> Session, 8 November 2017

## Peru

Delivered by Mr. Yoel Mester, Deputy Permanent Representative

Thank you, Mr. President,

Israel welcomes the delegation of Peru to the UPR, and would like to thank it for its report.

Israel recognizes many steps taken by Peru since its last UPR, such as the adoption of the Trafficking in Persons and Smuggling of Migrants Act; the repeal of Police's regulation imposing sanctions on personnel for having same-sex relationships; the development of the "Racism Warning" platform; the development of the National Plan to Combat Trafficking in Persons (2017-2021), the National Plan to Combat Forced Labour and the "Prosper" Strategy for the Reduction of Urban Poverty; among others .

However, certain challenges remain. Therefore, Israel would like to recommend Peru the following:

- 1. To amend the Civil Code to fully recognize the legal capacity of persons with disabilities and to ensure that they have access to inclusive education and appropriate health care services.
- 2. To ensure that sexual orientation, gender identity and expression are included as prohibited grounds for discrimination in the legislation, and to take steps towards the legal recognition of the identity of transgender persons.
- 3. To take measures to improve women representation in decision-making positions in the public sector, including considering the adoption of temporary special measures to accelerate this objective.
- To take measures to reduce cases of violence against women, including training
  of security forces, prosecutors and judges to increase awareness and gendersensitivity.

Israel wishes Peru a successful UPR.
