Committee A (11.2) Public Health Emergency Preparedness and Response

Thank you Chairperson.

We would like to thank the secretariat for preparing the reports on this item.

The importance of strengthening national health systems' preparedness to respond to crisis cannot be overestimated. We would like to join the voices heard today in support of WHO's work in this context.

We wish to add our strong appreciation of the WHO's Emergency Medical Teams (EMT's) Initiative. The EMT's initiative is based on two important foundations: assisting member states in building capacity and strengthening their emergency health systems, and allowing for the smooth deployment of quality assured medical teams when emergencies occur.
