

Official translations:

For documentation given **to the Finnish authorities**, you can use the services of a Finnish **Licensed Translator**. Translation by a Licensed Translator does not need to be verified with an Apostille stamp.

For documentation given **to authorities outside Finland** (e.g. Israeli authorities), the translation must be verified with an **Apostille stamp**. Please make sure the translator you are using is aware of this requirement.

A translation verified with an Apostille stamp is valid in all countries of the Hague treaty, including Finland and Israel.

If your documentation to be given to Finnish authorities is translated in Israel, the translation must be verified with an Apostille stamp by an Israeli Public Notary.
