About the Course

Background

The productivity of the Israeli dairy herd is among the highest in the world, despite the adverse conditions in which it takes place. This is the result of a joint effort by the sides responsible for the development of the sector and the constant adoption of innovative technologies and systems by the dairy farmers.

The dairy sector of Israel is characterized by farms with a healthy herd, which produces high milk quality (approximately 12,000 liters milk per lactation). This is due to an intense program promoting genetic improvements based on the findings of a comprehensive database. In addition to genetic innovation, other factors include: sophisticated production planning, the incorporation of technologies for the management and control of heat stress, along with comprehensive health programs.

Israel's successful dairy industry is constantly upgrading technologies in order to respond to fast changing conditions and to bring to market a wide and varied range of high quality dairy products.

In the past decade, the milk-producing sector has completed a national reform, aimed at-reducing the environmental impact of dairy cattle contamination, and providing a comprehensive and efficient waste management system.

During the course, the IDF World Dairy Summit will be held in Tel Aviv hosted by The Israel National Committee and the Israel Dairy Board.

Aims

The seminar aims are to share with the participants the structure and organization of the dairy sector in Israel; policies and strategies that drive their development; management of intensive production systems; supporting institutions and applied technologies, and also to create a framework for discussion and analysis of criteria for evaluating adaptation of that technology and management.

- ◆ Milking management and milking parlors

Qualifications

Priority will be given to professionals from extension and academic fields, involved in dairy cattle production projects and technologies with (and/or under the sponsorship of) national and/or international organizations, institutions, universities, NGO`s and the private sector.

Course participants must have a relevant academic degree and at least three years of practical work experience. A very good command of the English language is essential.

General Information

Location and accommodation

The course will be held at CINADCO's International Training Centre at Kibbutz Hotel Shefayim, situated 20 km north of Tel Aviv near the coastal city of Netanya.

Transportation

Participants will be transported from and to Ben Gurion airport, **without charge**, by Tal Limousine Company, which is located on the mezzanine level at the Arrivals Hall. Participants are requested not to take any other transport company.

Clothing

The course will be held in the autumn season. Temperatures may vary between 12°C and 25°C with probabilities of rainfall. It is therefore recommended to bring warm clothing, suitable footwear for field trips and swimwear.

Insurance

Participants are medically insured by a health insurance policy. This policy does not cover the treatment of chronic or serious diseases, dental care, eyeglasses, pregnancy and specific medication taken by the participant on a regular basis. Participants are required to bring with them their usual medication. No insurance of personal belongings like money, video cameras, laptops or jewelry will be provided.
