

Purim street parties

Purim is a Jewish holiday observed on March 16, 2014. It commemorates the deliverance of the Jewish people in the ancient Persian Empire from destruction in the wake of a plot by Haman. According to the Book of Esther, in the Hebrew Bible, Haman, royal vizier to King Ahasuerus (presumed to be Xerxes I of Persia), planned to kill all the Jews in the empire, but his plans were foiled by Mordecai and his adopted daughter Queen Esther. The day of deliverance became a day of feasting and rejoicing.

Purim has more of a national than a religious character, and its status as a holiday is on a lesser level than those days ordained holy by the Torah, Accordingly, business transactions and even manual labor are allowed on Purim. One can find many parades and Street Parties everywhere...

9,000-year-old stone masks all originated in the same region in the ancient Land of Israel

The Israel Museum brings together for the first time a rare group of 9,000-year-old stone masks, the oldest known to date, in a new exhibition starting 11/3. Culminating nearly a decade of research, "Face to Face: The Oldest Masks in the World" showcases 12 extraordinary Neolithic masks, all originating in the same region in the ancient Land of Israel.

Originally they are all from the same region, found within only about 30 km. from each other in the Judean Hills and nearby in the Judean Desert. It is the first time that the group will be shown together, in their birthplace, and also the first time that the majority of them will be on public view, as they are usually part of private collections. The Israel Museum has held in its collections two Neolithic stone masks so far.
